



St. Thomas Aquinas Program

The St. Thomas Aquinas Program serves qualified students who need additional academic support due to the diagnosis of a learning disability and/or ADHD. The goal of the Aquinas Program is to provide support for continuing development of skills and to guide each student as he/she becomes an independent learner. The Aquinas Program Director assists in parent and teacher contact and acts as an advocate for students in the program.

Once accepted into the program, the students meet one period daily during their history period (6th grade), science period (7th grade), foreign language period (8th grade), or during their normal study hall time (high school). During this time, students are instructed in organizational skills, study strategies, and test taking skills. The Aquinas Program is not a tutoring program. Therefore, homework and preparation for tests and quizzes, projects, papers, etc. are the responsibility of the student. It is imperative that the students work at home with the diligence and determination that is required for academic success at St. Joseph's. Cooperation of the enrolled students and their parents is essential to the academic success of our students. It is essential that both students and parents follow through on recommendations that contribute to the stated goal.

The cost of the St Thomas Aquinas program is \$2,250 annually. This will be billed in accordance with the tuition plan that you chose on your Enrollment/Re-Enrollment Contract. For Plan A, charges will be included on your July statement; for Plan B, charges will appear on your July and January statements. For Plan C and D participants, charges will be included with the monthly amount that is drafted from your account.
