404 - Economics (Mr. Stanton) _____ Rising Grades 10/11/12 ½ Credit

This one-semester course covers the basic principles and theories of economics. It also examines the practical application of these theories in contemporary society and government. Tax forms, personal budgeting, and a stock market simulation are all part of the course. One session offered.

Dates: June 7-18, Mon-Fri from 9:00 AM-1:00 PM each day in class virtually, plus additional online lessons and work on your own with a **Final Project due on or before July 2.**

408 - Government (Mrs. Carr) _____ Rising Grades 11/12 ½ Credit

United States Government is a one-semester required history course that will examine the basic principles of our government: the workings of the legislative, the executive, and the judicial branches, and the sharing of power between the state and federal governments. A portion of the class is dedicated to discussion of current events and debate, as well as a further examination of constitutional principles as applied to today's issues. Students must remain current on national events. The course will involve 9 days of required attendance at virtual classes plus additional online lessons on your own.

Dates: July 21-22, July 26-29 and August 2-4 from 9:00 AM-12:00 PM each day in class virtually, plus an additional week of flexible online lessons and work that you do on your own, with a **Final Project due on or before August 11.**

Due to the condensed time frame of this class, it is critical for students to attend all of the virtual class sessions. There is flexibility with the week of lessons on their own, but the project must be turned in on or before August 11.
